Choose 2-3 activities each week



<p>Write a Book Review</p> <p>Write a book review for your book. First summarize the book, then write about your favourite part and why others would enjoy the book. You may want to include stars, thumbs up/down or some other rating system. Your book review should be at least 2-3 paragraphs long.</p>	<p>Questioning</p> <p>Write 6 questions about your book. Start each question with: who, what, where, when, why and how. Answer your questions.</p>	<p>Top Ten List</p> <p>Make a Top Ten list of events from your book in order of importance to the story. The most important event should be #1.</p>
<p>Write a Poem</p> <p>Write a poem about a character or event in your book. Your poem should be at least 12 lines long.</p>	<p>Letter to the Author</p> <p>Write a letter to the author of the book telling him or her how you felt about the book. Ask at least 3 questions about the book. Your letter should be at least 2-3 paragraphs long.</p>	<p>Create a Table</p> <p>Rule up your page so that there are 4 sections. Label the sections: Main character, Setting, Important Events and My Opinion. Write 3-5 sentences in each section.</p>
<p>Main Character</p> <p>Write a paragraph describing what the main character in your book might be doing ten years in the future. Illustrate your paragraph.</p>	<p>Comic Strip</p> <p>Make a comic for one of the chapters of your book. Use pictures, captions and speech bubbles to tell the story.</p>	<p>Summary</p> <p>Write a summary of your book using exactly 60 words. You will probably need to write several rough drafts before you get a summary you are happy with.</p>
